Contrary to paragraphs 301(a)(i), 301(a)(iii) and 905(b)(v) and pursuant to paragraphs 901 and 901.7 of the Code of Conduct of the Bar of England and Wales (8th Edition).

Details of Offence

Lloyd Aneke engaged in conduct which was discreditable to a barrister in that between the 15th January 2004 and the 28th January 2005 as set out more particularly in the Findings of the Solicitors Disciplinary Tribunal filed with the Law Society on the 3rd October 2006, he engaged in conduct unbecoming a solicitor, including reckless and improper stewardship of client money, for which misconduct he was convicted and struck off the Roll of Solicitors of the Law Society of England and Wales.

Lloyd Aneke engaged in conduct which was likely to diminish the public confidence in the legal profession or otherwise bring the profession into disrepute in that between the 15th January 2004 and the 28th January 2005 as set out more particularly in the Findings of the Solicitors Disciplinary Tribunal filed with the Law Society on the 3rd October 2006, he engaged in conduct unbecoming a solicitor, including reckless and improper stewardship of client money, for which misconduct he was convicted and struck off the Roll of Solicitors of the Law Society of England and Wales.

Lloyd Aneke failed to report promptly (or at all) to the Bar Council that he had been convicted of a disciplinary offence by another professional body, namely conduct unbecoming a solicitor, and that, on the 27th September 2006, he had been struck off the Roll of Solicitors of the Law Society of England and Wales.

SENTENCE: Disbarred. Reprimanded.

STATUS: Open to Appeal.
