Charged with:

Professional misconduct contrary Core Duty 5 and/or Core Duty 9 and/or rC8 and/or rC65.3 and/or rC65.7 of the Bar Standards Board Handbook and 9th Edition of the Code of Conduct. An unregistered barrister, acted in a manner which was likely to diminish the trust and confidence which the public places in him or the profession, and/or acted in a manner which could reasonably be seen by the public to undermine his integrity; An unregistered barrister, acted in a manner which was likely to diminish the trust and confidence which the public places in him or the profession, and/or acted in a manner which could reasonably be seen by the public to undermine his honesty and/or integrity; An unregistered barrister, failed to be open and co-operative with his regulator, and/or failed to comply with the obligations under rC65.3.

Professional misconduct contrary 301 (a) (i), (ii) and/or (iii) and/or 901.7 and/or 905 (b) (iv) and/or 905 (b) (v) of the Code of Conduct of the Bar of England and Wales (8th Edition). An unregistered barrister, engaged in conduct which was discreditable to a barrister, prejudicial to the administration of justice and/or likely to diminish public confidence in the legal profession or the administration of justice or otherwise bring the legal profession into disrepute; An unregistered barrister, failed to report promptly to the Bar Standards Board.
