Details of Offence

Constance Briscoe between the 16th May 2011 and the 8th October 2013, engaged in conduct which was dishonest and discreditable to a barrister, which conduct led to her conviction on the 1st May 2014 at the Crown Court at the Central Criminal Court on three counts of doing acts tending and intended to pervert the course of justice, for which a sentence of 16 months imprisonment was imposed on the 2nd May 2014.

Constance Briscoe between the 16th May 2011 and the 8th October 2013, engaged in conduct which was prejudicial to the administration of justice, which conduct led to her conviction on the 1st May 2014 at the Crown Court at the Central Criminal Court on three counts of doing acts tending and intended to pervert the course of justice, for which a sentence of 16 months imprisonment was imposed on the 2nd May 2014.

Constance Briscoe between the 16th May 2011 and the 8th October 2013, engaged in conduct which was likely to diminish public confidence in the legal profession or the administration of justice or otherwise bring the profession into disrepute, which conduct led to her conviction on the 1st May 2014 at the Crown Court at the Central Criminal Court on three counts of doing acts tending and intended to pervert the course of justice, for which a sentence of 16 months imprisonment was imposed on the 2nd May 2014.

SENTENCE: Disbarred.
