## In breach of

Contrary to paragraph 301(a)(i) and pursuant to paragraph 901.7 of the Code of Conduct of the Bar of England and Wales (8<sup>th</sup> Edition) and Core Duty 5 of the Bar Standards Board Handbook (1<sup>st</sup> Edition).

## **Details of Offence**

Philip Pawson engaged in conduct that was dishonest or otherwise discreditable to a barrister, in that, between the period 25<sup>th</sup> October 2007 and the 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2011, in that as a Director of nine companies he authorised six of those companies to pay him £5,000.00 for the same piece of legal work.

Philip Pawson, an unregistered barrister, engaged in conduct likely to diminish the trust and confidence in which the public places in a barrister or in the profession in that on the 5<sup>th</sup> December 2014 he exhibited to a sworn affidavit a document [contract of employment] intending to induce a court of law to believe it was genuine when he knew it was false.

**SENTENCE**: Disbarred.

**STATUS**: Final.
