In breach of

Paragraph 301 and pursuant to paragraph 901.7 of the Code of Conduct of the Bar of England and Wales (8th Edition) and Core Duty 5 of the Bar Standards Board Handbook (1st Edition).

Details of Offence

Sanjay Roy, a barrister, engaged in discreditable conduct in that between August 2013 and the 5th January 2014, he pursued a course of conduct against his partner, causing her to fear on more than one occasion that violence would be used against her and in respect of which conduct on the 9th July 2016 he was convicted at the Crown Court sitting at Nottingham after entering a plea of guilty to an offence of harassment with fear of violence contrary to section 4 of the Protection from Harassment Act 1997 for which offence he was sentenced to a term of 18 months imprisonment suspended for two years and also made subject to a restraining order.

Sanjay Roy, a barrister, engaged in discreditable conduct in that between the 6th January 2014 and September 2014, he pursued a course of conduct against his partner, causing her to fear on more than one occasion that violence would be used against her and in respect of which conduct on the 19th July 2016 he was convicted at the Crown Court sitting at Nottingham after entering a plea of guilty to an offence of harassment with fear of violence contrary to section 4 of the Protection from Harassment Act 1997 for which offence he was sentenced to a term of 18 months imprisonment suspended for two years and also made subject to a restraining order.

SENTENCE: Disbarred.
