AURANG KHATTAK

Called to the Bar by: Gray's Inn, April 1989

Type of hearing: 5 Person Tribunal

Date of decision: 13 February 2020

In breach of:

Paragraphs 301[a][i] and 901.7, 301[a][iii] and 901.7 of the Code of Conduct of the Bar of England and Wales [8th Edition.

Between January 2009 and 30 April 2012, Aurang Khattak, an unregistered barrister, who was also admitted to the Roll of Solicitors in 2000, engaged in conduct, whether in pursuit of his profession or otherwise, which was discreditable to a barrister as set out in the Judgment of the Solicitor's Disciplinary Tribunal.

Between January 2009 and 30 April 2012, Aurang Khattak, an unregistered barrister, who was also admitted to the Roll of Solicitors in 2000, engaged in conduct, whether in pursuit of his profession or otherwise, which was likely to diminish public confidence in the legal profession or the administration of justice or otherwise bring the legal profession into disrepute as set out in Judgement of the Solicitor's Disciplinary Tribunal.

Sanction: Fined £1000. Ordered not to be issued with a Practising Certificate for 2 years. Costs of £600 to be paid to the Bar Standards Board.

Status: Open to Appeal.
