Core Duties 3 and 5 of the Bar Standards Board Handbook.

Details of offence:

Peter Moss failed to act with honesty and/or integrity, in that between the 6 April 2009 and 6 April 2016, he was knowingly concerned in the fraudulent evasion of income tax in that he failed to complete self-assessment returns for income tax or pay the correct income tax due to Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs for which conduct on 22 June 2018 he was convicted at Leeds Combined Court and sentenced to 18 months in custody.

Peter Moss acted in a way likely to diminish the trust and confidence which the public places in a barrister or in the profession, in that between the 6 April 2009 and 6 April 2016, he was knowingly concerned in the fraudulent evasion of income tax in that he failed to complete self-assessment returns for income tax or pay the correct income tax due to Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs for which conduct on 22 June 2018 he was convicted at Leeds Combined Court and sentenced to 18 months in custody.
