Core Duty 5, Rules rC65.1 and rC65.2 of the Bar Standards Board Handbook.

Details of offence:

Felix Evans, an unregistered barrister, acted in a way which was likely to diminish the trust and confidence which the public places in a barrister or in the profession in that on the 12 February 2017, he caused wounding / grievous bodily harm to another person. As a result of the assault, on 3 January 2018, he was convicted of an offence contrary to s20 Offences Against the Person Act 1861 and was sentenced to 24 months in custody, suspended for 24 months, and ordered to pay £5000 compensation and £140 victim surcharge.

Felix Evans, an unregistered barrister, did not report promptly to the Bar Standards Board that he was, on 12 June 2017, charged with an indictable offence.

Felix Evans, an unregistered barrister, did not reply report promptly to the Bar Standards Board that he was, on 3 January 2018, he was convicted of causing grievous bodily harm, contrary to s20 Offences Against the Person Act 1861.

Sanction: Suspended for 3 Years. Fined £2000. Costs £250 + VAT.

Status: Open to Appeal.
